ue to the long delay in the Janitors review which has just restarted this week, the cleaning review has been put back to the beginning of January.

There was a proposal to start your review in December for three weeks and suspend consultation over the festive break.

This was rejected by UNISON as there may be serious consequences for your tems and conditions and you will need the support of the union and Council during this potentially difficult time.
