For financial help apply on one of our forms – you can download them at unison.org.uk/thereforyou or get one from your branch – your branch welfare officer will help you fill it in and talk to you about how we can help.

3 We do the rest

Once we've received your form, one of our experienced case-workers will assess your application and will let you know if we can help. You can also expect information on benefits and help that may be available from elsewhere.

Financial assistance A grant from us can help you rest easy again

Extended illness. Family bereavement. Relationship breakdown. Life can be hard and it just gets harder when you are suddenly trying to cope with less money coming in or, unexpected costs at a time when you're not feeling anywhere near your best.

We make more than 2,000 grants to UNISON members and their families every year, often helping with household bills, essential 'white goods' such as cookers or washing machines, heating and fares to hospital. At other times we help with housing problems, and provide support where matters have become so difficult that the courts are involved. Grants for special equipment and adaptations for those with disabilities or special needs are also available.
