The Council's network for colleagues with disabilities or long-term health conditions have recently chosen SPARC (Supporting People's Abilities Regardless of Circumstance) as their name. As Equalities Officer, I look forward to working alongside SPARC, and all colleague networks, to continue developing the Council's approach to creating a fully inclusive workplace. One of the forums where we do this is the Diversity and Inclusion Focus Group which sees colleague networks, trade unions, HR colleagues and Councillors meet every 3 months to shape the work around inclusion, diversity and equality. Michael, Branch Equalities Officer, has recently chaired meetings of Polish activists as part of our ongoing response to the horrific situation facing the LGBT+ community in Poland. Around 1 in 3 municipalities have declared themselves to either be LGBT-Free Zones or they have signed a very conservative "Family Charter" which doesn't recognise LGBT+ families or identities.



Michael has contacted UNISON's National LGBT+ Group and is hoping to speak at the Edinburgh Trades Union Council (ETUC) meeting later this month. Representatives from trade unions across various sectors attend the ETUC so it's a great opportunity for focussing the collective power of trade unions.
