

Don't let the far right divide us



SAT 7 SEP, 12PM GEORGE SQ REFUGEES WELCOME— NAE NAZIS IN GLASGOW

THE FAR-RIGHT is trying to exploit horror in Southport using the horrific murder of three children to push its Islamophobic, racist, anti-refugee agenda—even though the perpetrator of the crimes was not a migrant as they falsely claimed.

This rhetoric led to a violent fascist riot outside a mosque in Southport and then in London and Hartlepool. Others now hope to build on this to create a climate of violence and fear against Muslims, migrants and ethnic minorities.

In Glasgow, a rescheduled racist protest now taking place on 7 September wants to bring this hate to our city. Figures backing it include fascist leader 'Tommy

Robinson'. Disguised as a 'pro-UK rally' to 'defend our country', in reality this is a rallying call for all those who want to make society less united, safe and diverse.

This is a disgusting response to human tragedy. We cannot allow the far right to capitalise on the loss of precious lives. Don't buy into its lies. Don't let the far right divide us. Join anti-racists, trade unionists, faith organisations, refugee groups and many more to stand in unity and solidarity and celebrate our city's proud tradition of welcoming refugees.

The fascists think this is their opportunity to regroup. It's crucial we send them back to the gutter

they came from the last time Glasgow showed them they're not welcome here.

After Reform UK got 7 percent of the vote in Scotland in the general election, the highest vote ever for a far-right party, we must act urgently to counteract their racist poison. And on 27 July, at least 15,000 joined a rally in London organised by Nazi 'Tommy Robinson'—it was one of the biggest far-right rallies ever in Britain.

A big, united anti-racist and anti-fascist show of solidarity on 7 September can break the far-right's attempts to grow in Scotland.
