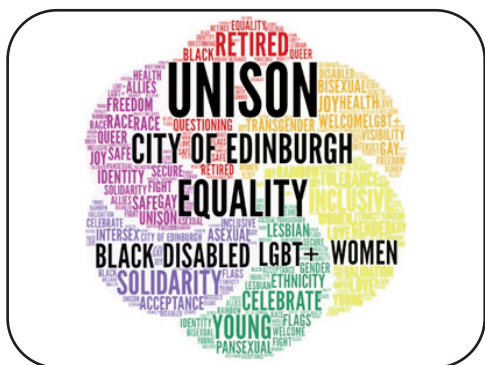

International day against Homophobia, Transphobia & Biphobia 2025

International Day Against Homophobia & Biphobia is an annual event that takes place this year on the 17 May to draw attention to the discrimination and violence faced by LGBT+ people world wide.

This day was first conceived in 2005 to highlight the discrimination faced by LGBT+ people around the world and is held on the 17 May in order to mark the World Health Organization's decision to remove homosexuality from its list of mental illnesses in 1990.



We will have a table at Waverley Court on the 15th to mark the day. Please come along and say Hi if you're around.

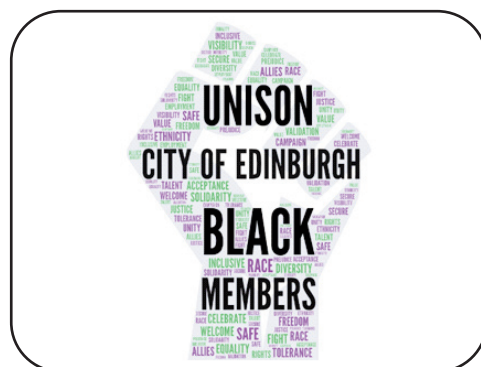
World Refugee Day

World Refugee Day is the 20 June each year. It has been designated by the United Nations to honour refugees around the world and celebrate the courage & strength they have shown when forced to flee their country. World Refugee Day was held globally for the first time on 20 June 2001 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the

1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees. It was originally known as Africa Refugee Day, before the United Nations General Assembly officially designated it as an international day in December 2000

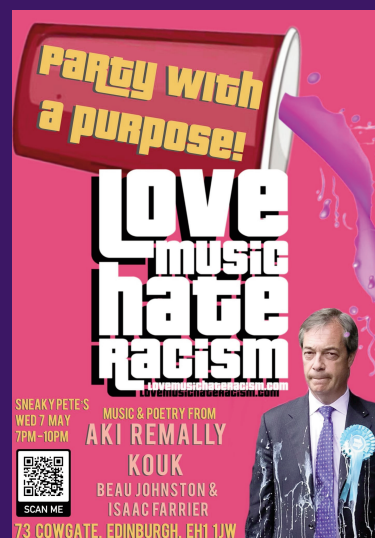

UNISON City of Edinburgh Branch is affiliated with and supports many different organisations and charities, and we will have a look at each one in these newsletters. First up is SERA.

SERA is the Scottish Emergency Rescue Association whose founder and chair is Garry Bennett who some of you might have seen speak at our last A.G.M. SERA source redundant fire engines and ambulances and equipment and repair and refurbish them to full operational use. Over 90 vehicles have been delivered to countries such as Moldova, Ukraine, Serbia,

Romania & Burundi. They have also trained hundreds of firefighters in each of those countries to safely use and maintain these vehicles and equipment. We are proud to support this amazing charity and if you'd like more information, it can be found at sera.scot.



UNISON Self-organised Groups
